Re: Year 11 Mock exams

In preparation for GCSE exams, Year 11 students will be sitting mock exams. As per the 'key dates for year 11' and the school calendar (both of which can be found on the school website) these will take place from Monday 19th November to Friday 30th November.

Attached (in yellow) is the general timetable. Students will receive individual timetables in due course.
