Expectations and content - What is this unit about and why do we teach it?

Unit 2: Devising Drama – "Think before you drink"

This unit introduces students to the concept of devising drama from a stimulus. Over the course of the Autumn term (1 lesson a week), students will explore the dynamics of collaborating with others to create thought-provoking and challenging drama material. Students will be inspired by the work of Frantic Assembly and other performance artists in creating their own devising work. This is a practical component in which students are assessed on their ability to create and develop ideas to communicate meaning for theatrical performance, apply theatrical skills to realise artistic intentions in live performance and analyse and evaluate their own work.

<u>Drama skills</u>

Vocal skills (the way an actor communicates using their voice) TRIPPPP

• Tone, rhythm, intonation, pitch, pace, pause, projection. Physical skills (the way an actor communicates using their body)

BOMBS

• Body language, gesture, movement, blocking, spatial relationships. FACE



 Facial expression, accent, configuration, eye contact.

Knowledge and understanding

- Genre
- Sub-text
- Character motivation and interaction
- Dramatic climax
- Stage configuration and stage directions
- Relationship between performer and audience
- Design of set, props, costume, lighting and sound
- Performer's vocal and physical interpretation of character
