

Consultation Proposal to Open Two Targeted Mainstream Provisions (TMP's)

## **Purpose of this Consultation**

To explain the proposal by Heartwood Learning Trust to establish two Targeted Mainstream Provision (TMP's) for secondary aged children and young people with Social Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) and Communication and Interaction (C&I) needs at Barlby High School.

On 14th April 2025 North Yorkshire Council (NYC) formally confirmed acceptance of our application to implement two targeted SEN provisions in our mainstream school; TMP's.

## Consultation

To add two target mainstream provisions (TMP's) within Barlby High School as follows:-

- Unit 1 Focusing on Social Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs
- Unit 2 Focusing on Communication and Interaction (C&I) needs

Each provision will be structured as follows:-

- 1. Provide 8 full time places (allocated via North Yorkshire Council)
  - 6 children and young people will have an Education, Health and Care Plan
  - 2 'transitional' places for children needing to access the provision for short term assessment and support
- 2. Open on a phased approach
  - September 2025 the units will open up for the 2 'transitional' places which will equate to 4 students in total
  - January 2026 the units will open fully as detailed within point 1
- 3. Meet the needs of children and young people within the allocated unit.
- 4. Provide a range of therapies and opportunities to ensure children are fully supported.

- 5. Increase the opportunities for children and young people with SEND to access mainstream education together with more specialised small group interventions and support
- 6. Be funded on a 'place' basis similar to meet the needs of the allocated children and young people based on national guidance and as defined by NYC.

In collaboration with NYC, Barlby High School wants all children and young people with SEND in North Yorkshire to have the ability to attend a mainstream school provision and become part of a supportive community while having the opportunity to progress educationally.

The existing capacity of the school is 720 with a roll of 524. Barlby High School has the capacity to accommodate these provisions and will enable us to support the needs of our wider community.

We are proud to be given this opportunity which is supported by the NYC SEND Strategy 2023-26.
